Hi! My name is Lyla McGuinness, and I am one of the year 12 representatives of our 2023/24 school council. So far the Student Council has had four meetings where we have discussed several topics that we would like to address. Some of the things that we are looking at doing as a council are:

- Making a student guide on how to use class charts
- Finding spots for students to revise to improve academic achievements
- Exploring life skills courses
- Promoting Extra Curricular Clubs
- Working with Big Fresh our Catering Provider to improve the canteen service

These are only a few of the things that the council are planning to achieve over this academic year.

Last week we presented to the whole school about tackling bullying too as we want to work with the teachers and support staff in our school to #makeanoiseaboutbullying. We have also had a meeting with the Mayor of Llantwit to talk about ways we can link ourselves to the community better, engaged in student ambassador training with the Vale of Glamorgan and took a trip to the Barry Civic Offices to meet with other schools in the Vale. We discussed what the other school councils had talked about, if there were similar issues within the schools, and ways that we can resolve them. Here we learnt about #whiteribbonday, which is a National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women on Saturday 25th November. To help tackle and end violence against women Rizik has created a presentation which shares with students the impacts and dangers of peer on peer sexual harassment through online platforms and in school and encourages young men to call it out when safe an able.

<u>ParentPay</u>

We are continuing to move towards a 'cash-less' school. All trips and items for purchase will now be set up via ParentPay, allowing you to pay online without the need to send money into us.

Please use the ParentPay system to make any required payments, and avoid sending in cash payments into the school. If you have not already set up a ParentPay account, please contact us and we will be happy to send you the relevant link and details to put this in place.

Using ParentPay not only allows you to make payments, it provides a list of all the payments you have made and provides details of any balances due and when they are required.

As you know ParentPay is also used by our pupils to pay for their school meal. Please remember to check your child's balance regularly to ensure they have sufficient funds available to purchase their meal. For those pupils who do go 'overdrawn' letters will now be sent to parents/careers to advise them of any negative balances.

Contacting School

Please be reminded that we operate an appointments only system for meeting with parents and if you present at school requesting an immediate appointment we will not be able to accommodate you.

Forgotten Items

We can no longer accept the delivery of forgotten items such as PE kit, books, lunch boxes etc. during the school day. Please ensure your child arrives at school with the equipment needed for the day. In the exceptional case that you do need to bring an item into school for your child, you will be asked to leave it on the desk in the main entrance. This is to reduce traffic on to the school site and ensure student safety during lesson transitions.

Medication

Please note we **do not** stock medication of any kind in school, including paracetamol, and we are not allowed to dispense medication without parental consent. If your child receives prescribed medication a medical form, available from main Reception to be collected by your son/daughter, will be required to be completed and returned to Reception. Should your child need medication throughout the school day please ensure they bring just what is needed for the day to school with them.
