


GREASE IS THE WORD


Geography Department News

Year 8 have been working hard designing earthquake proof buildings using cross bracing and reinforcement to take on the 'shake table'!






Not one to sit back and watch opportunities pass her by, Meghan will also be joining students from across the country at Salford University where she will participate in a broad-based engineering course.



Alternative Timetable





Year 7 Art and Design


