Message from the Headteacher

Welcome to this week's edition of Major News.

3 2024

Many of you will be aware from discussions with your child/children that we have been working hard to improve our canteen facilities this year. As a result of pupil voice, we reopened the canteen for breaktime service in January. This move has been very positively received by the pupils. We have also had a second serving hatch installed over the Whitsun break which is resulting in both break and lunchtime service being quicker.

We are also completing a lot of stakeholder voice at present with the aim of continuing to make our school better. One of the things raised in the recent parent survey was the length of lunch (currently an hour, which is longer than most schools across Wales, with the average being around 40 minutes) and the desire for a greater staff presence at breaktimes and lunchtimes.

We are therefore going to trial a single, slightly longer break and single, slightly shorter lunch this half term, with effect from Monday 10th June. This will give us the opportunity to test whether we can serve all the pupils comfortably in a single sitting. We will also analyse behaviour across the site during lunchtime. Having a single lunch should also make for a more settled period 4, as currently during period 4 half of the school are out on lunch when the other half are in lessons. This inevitably results in some noise and interruptions, which can be a barrier to learning.

Each year group will still have an allocated outdoor space to use during the trial. Pupils regularly raise the desire for more indoor spaces to use at breaktimes and lunchtimes when the weather is poor. At present, we are unable to provide more indoor spaces as they are being used for lessons. Switching to a single break and lunch would allow us to provide more indoor spaces and would also provide us with the flexibility to offer a wider variety of extra-curricular activities at lunchtime. In addition, more staff will be out and about on duty to ensure a calm, orderly environment as there will only be one lunch and break to supervise, not two.

Pupils have been informed of the intention to trial this new approach in form time this week. I would like to reiterate that the period will be just that- a trial. We will try this for a few weeks, then conduct lots of stakeholder voice to see what everyone thinks of the new approach and whether it's something we should continue with on a more

permanent basis. Parents/carers also raised in the recent parent survey that they felt registration would be better placed at the beginning of the day, rather than just before and after break in order for pupils' form tutors to be their first point of contact each day. We are unable to make this change at this point in the school year due to timetabling constraints, but if we did proceed with a single break and lunchtime on a more permanent basis then we would seek to place registration at the beginning of the day.

I will update you regarding the impact of the trial in future weekly newsletters.




GUYS AND DOLLS 6 WEEK COUNT DOWN

Contacting School

Please refrain from telephoning the school, other than for urgent purposes. For all general enquiries please email <u>llantwitmajorhs@valeofglamorgan.gov.uk</u>. Please be reminded that we operate an appointments only system for meeting with parents/carers and if you present at school requesting an immediate appointment we will not be able to accommodate you.

Forgotten Items

We can no longer accept the delivery of forgotten items such as PE kit, books, lunch boxes etc. during the school day. Please ensure your child arrives at school with the equipment needed for the day. In the exceptional case that you do need to bring an item into school for your child, you will be asked to leave it on the desk in the main entrance. This is to reduce traffic on to the school site and ensure student safety during lesson transitions.

Medication

Please note we **do not** stock medication of any kind in school, including paracetamol, and we are not allowed to dispense medication without parental consent. If your child receives prescribed medication a medical form, available from main Reception to be collected by your son/daughter, will be required to be completed and returned to Reception. Should your child need medication throughout the school day please ensure they bring just what is needed for the day to school with them.
