

The School Day

NOTE: We attach great importance to punctuality and regular attendance, both of which are monitored closely. Please ensure that if your child is ill, you report this on classcharts or phone the school answerphone. Ideally, it is wise that a call is made every day that your child is absent, or if you know your child will be absent or a period of time, then just inform us of that on the first day.

Emergency Telephone Contact

Parents and Carers are requested to provide the school with a telephone contact, number, or numbers, for use in emergencies. It will then be possible, should the need arise, for parents to be contacted either at home or at the place of work etc. *Please inform the school promptly if these details or telephone numbers change.*

Medical and Dental Inspections and Appointments

Wherever possible please arrange appointments outside of school hours. Pupils with appointments during school hours are asked to bring their appointment card to the school. In order that the necessary checks may be made for registration purposes, pupils should sign out at the office before leaving the school premises and sign back in on return.

Healthy Eating

The school canteen operates a healthy eating menu with many meals having a higher fibre, lower fat and sugar content, than has been traditionally. It is hoped that parents will actively support these initiatives and encourage the pupils to follow healthy eating habits. The school has also achieved the National Quality Award for Healthy Schools. No items with peanuts in are allowed in school.

Lunch Arrangements

On Day 1 parents will be required to provide a packed lunch for Year 7 students.

From day 2, pupils may either:

- purchase lunches prepared at the school; or
- they may bring a packed lunch.

School Lunches

The School operates a cashless fob system. All pupils wishing to purchase meals or snacks from the canteen will be issued with a fob.

In an attempt to remove all cash from school we are asking all parents to only use our e-payment method to pay for **dinner money**, **trips**, **music lessons etcetera**. This can be done online using a very secure website called *ParentPay*.

Lost fobs are blocked when the loss is reported and the balance is transferred to a new fob. There is a charge for a replacement fob.

Meals are served on a cafeteria system. A variety of main courses, salads, sandwiches and snacks are on offer daily.

All pupils in Years 7-11 are required to remain on site for their lunch break.

Equipment required by pupils

Basic equipment such as pens, pencils, ruler and rubbers are essential.

A scientific calculator and a geometry set are required for use in Mathematics.

Clothing for School

Mandatory Requirement to wear School Clothing

By agreement with the Governing Body of the School, rules require all pupils to wear the approved school clothes. The school Governors consider that uniform promotes positive attitudes, high standards and a suitable image in the eyes of the community. It is for these reasons that our uniform requirements are enforced vigorously. *PLEASE READ OUR REQUIREMENTS CAREFULLY BEFORE COMPLETING THE ADMISSION FORM. IN CHOOSING OUR SCHOOL, YOU ARE AGREEING THAT YOUR CHILD WILL CONFORM TO OUR UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS.*

School Clothes: Years Seven to Eleven

Mandatory Range of Everyday Wear

SKIRT or TROUSERS or SHORTS	Plain black, <u>knee length</u> or Plain black – CLASSIC CUT or Plain black, tailored, knee length	No jeans, cords, leggings or jeggings, leather, flared, flecked, striped or patterned, nor any other variation of black. <u>PLEASE</u> <u>NOTE LEGGINGS ARE NOT PERMITTED.</u>
SHIRT	Plain white shirt with collar	No other alternative is acceptable.
TIE	Red and Blue School Tie (available in both clip and traditional versions)	No alternative or lack of tie is acceptable.
V-NECKED SWEATER	Optional wear over shirt. Navy blue with embroidered school logo	No alternative is acceptable. No alternative under-garment is acceptable. No lack of shirt is acceptable.
SOCKS STOCKINGS OR TIGHTS	Plain Black	No alternative is acceptable.
SHOES	Plain black, <u>low heeled</u>	No other colour is acceptable. Backless shoes are not acceptable. Boots, fancy patterns and suede are not acceptable. High heels must not be worn. Should a pupil need to wear a soft shoe for medical reasons a parental/doctor's letter is required.
TOPCOAT:	A practical all weather coat.	Casual, fashion, denim and leather jackets are NOT permitted.

Uniform is available locally

JEWELLERY: Please note that no jewellery is permitted in Physical Education lessons for health and safety reasons.

MAKE-UP: Make-up is only permitted if worn in a discreet, natural manner. False nails and/or nail varnish are not permitted.

HAIR: No excessively extreme short shaved haircuts will be allowed (e.g. tram lines, shaved heads or Mohicans etc). No unusual/unnatural dye/colouring is allowed (e.g. pink, red, green etc).

Clothing for Physical Education / Games

COMPULSORY RANGE	
POLO SHIRT	Navy, short sleeves, button at neck, with integral School Sports Logo
RUGBY JERSEY	Navy blue/white school jersey compulsory for pupils involved with outdoor activities such as rugby.
RUGBY/HOCKEY/SOCCER SOCKS/SHIN PADS	Navy
SHORTS <u><i>OR</i></u> LEGGINGS	Navy – two pairs are advisable for pupils involved with soccer/rugby.
SWIMWEAR	Swim shorts OR one piece costume (towel also to be supplied).
SPORTS TRAINERS	
RUGBY/SOCCER BOOTS	Compulsory for rugby/soccer. Plastic/rubber studs or blades.
OPTIONAL RANGE	
SWIMMING GOGGLES	For your child's comfort (optional).
NAVY JOGGING BOTTOMS	Optional but strongly recommended for Winter months.
GUM SHIELD	Optional but strongly recommended for hockey/rugby.
NAVY SKORT	Recommended for pupils who play netball for the school. (a skort is a combination of shorts and a skirt).
NAVY ¼ ZIP TOP	Navy, with integral School Sports Logo for your child's comfort when outside.
