

Clothing for School

Mandatory Requirement to wear School Clothing

By agreement with the Governing Body of the School, Rules require all pupils to wear the approved school clothes. The School Governors consider that uniform promotes positive attitudes, high standards and a suitable image in the eyes of the community. It is for these reasons that our uniform requirements are enforced vigorously.

School Clothes: Years Twelve and Thirteen

Mandatory Range of Everyday Wear

SKIRT or TROUSERS or SHORTS	Plain black, knee length or Plain black - CLASSIC CUT or Plain black, tailored, knee length	<i>Not patterned or mottled, not shorter or longer Not jeans, cords, leggings or jeggings, leather, flared, flecked, striped or patterned, nor any other variation of grey</i>
SHIRT	Plain white with collar	<i>No alternative is acceptable.</i>
TIE	Red with white stripe	<i>No alternative is acceptable. No lack of tie is acceptable.</i>
JUMPER	Optional wear over shirt. Plain black with embroidered Senior School logo.	<i>No alternative is acceptable No alternative under-garment is acceptable. No lack of shirt is acceptable.</i>
SOCKS STOCKINGS OR TIGHTS	Plain black	<i>No alternative is acceptable</i>
SHOES	Plain black, low heeled	<i>No other colour is acceptable Boots, fancy patterns and suede are not acceptable High heels must not be worn</i>
TOPCOAT	A single dark plain colour waist or hip length, with or without hood, anorak/jacket	<i>Casual, fashion, denim and leather jackets are NOT permitted.</i>

Uniform is available locally

Please note: For reasons of safety and security in School the wearing of bracelets, neck chains, earrings and rings is **not** encouraged. Ear-studs are strongly discouraged for the same practical reasons, but in any case not more than one stud per earlobe will be accepted. A discreet amount of make-up is permitted for senior students. False nails and/or nail varnish are not permitted. Coloured bows and head-bands are **NOT** allowed. Whilst headscarves are not allowed for the vast majority of pupils, in certain circumstances they may be permitted by the Headteacher.

Should there be any doubt about the acceptability of a particular item of wear, or of hairstyle or length, the Headteacher's decision must be accepted.
